



## **Bloodborne Pathogens Standard Compliance** **for Doctors and Dentists Offices**

### **Executive Summary**

OSHA estimates that 8 million workers in the health care industry and related occupations are at risk of occupational exposure to bloodborne pathogens. The Bloodborne Pathogens Standard, 29CFR1910.1030, applies to all occupational exposure and helps to protect employees from developing Hepatitis B, Hepatitis C and HIV.

#### *General Requirements of the Standard:*

- Written bloodborne pathogen exposure control plan designed to minimize or eliminate employee exposure. This includes:
  - Exposure determination
  - Methods of compliance
  - Engineering and work practice controls
  - Personal protective equipment
  - Housekeeping and laundry
  - Hepatitis B vaccination and post exposure evaluation and follow-up
  - Employee hazard communication information and training
